Dazzle Africa is a unique non-profit that partners with local organizations in Zambia to provide programs in conservation, education, and community development. Through safaris and local investment, we aim to ensure that future generations are self-sufficient and iconic wildlife thrive.



LETTER FROM OUR CEO

Dear Friends,

When you think of the word ‘gratitude’ what comes to mind? For me, it is undoubtedly the people of Zambia. They are some of the warmest and friendliest people I have ever met.



In 2012, Dazzle Africa was created to provide partnerships in the areas of education, conservation and community development in Zambia. We partnered with local organizations on the ground to maximize our impact and deliver our goals.

Ten years later and I am so proud of all that we have achieved so far. This year, we invested over \$517,000 in our community development, education and wildlife conservation programs in Zambia. We drilled 7 new boreholes in Eastern Zambia, taking our number up to 27. Furthermore, our generous donor, Lacey Miller, donated 25 new boreholes to rural villages in Zambia, which were matched by a further 25 by our field partner, The Bushcamp Company.

Our education program is also in full swing, with over 40 students sponsored so far, with 19 students being sponsored this year alone. Through our educational sponsorships, we aim to help Zambians take ownership of their lives and empower them to pursue their passions and become leaders of tomorrow.

When I first visited Zambia I was not only inspired by its people but equally its iconic wildlife. Through our field partners, Conservation South Luangwa and the Zambian Carnivore Programme, we invest in wildlife conservation programs that are helping protect endangered wildlife in the South Luangwa Valley. Thanks to the Cessna-180 plane and helicopter operations, our field partners are able to cover vast amounts of areas across South Luangwa which would otherwise not be possible. On the ground scouts are also helping protect wildlife from poachers, while a full-time vet which we help fund, ensures that any injured animal can be efficiently and effectively treated and saved.

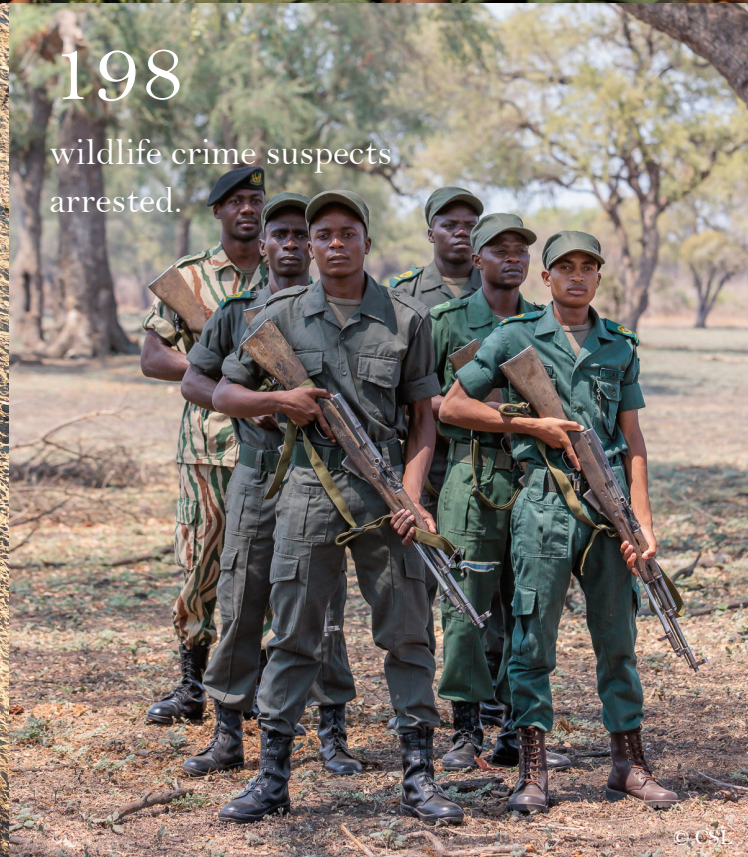

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION

We invest in wildlife conservation projects in Zambia that protect South Luangwa Valley's endangered wildlife and safeguards their precious habitats.

TREATING ZAMBIA'S WILD AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

In 2013, Dazzle Africa partnered with CSL and ZCP to rescue Zambia's injured wildlife by helping to fund the only wildlife veterinarian in South Luangwa Valley.

Before Dr. Sichande's presence, injured and sick animals were not able to receive the treatment and care they needed and many of them would succumb to their injuries. But in 2013, this all changed.

Since 2013, Dr. Sichande has been at the forefront of wildlife conservation, from de-snaring wildlife caught in poaching snares, to collaring wildlife for scientific monitoring and protection, to medically treating domestic animals.

This year alone, Dr. Sichande has de-snared 14 animals caught in poaching snares, collared 27 Africa wild dogs, 2 hyenas and 8 lionesses.

They also continue to care for domestic cats and dogs in the village of Mfuwe at the community veterinary clinic and through community outreach campaigns in the areas surrounding South Luangwa National Park. In 2022, they sterilized 46 dogs, 12 cats, and four rabbits.

In 2022, they also undertook an extensive rabies vaccination program and vaccinated 849 dogs and cats which saw a 157% increase compared to 2021. Rabies is a deadly virus that poses a serious threat to humans and wildlife alike, so keeping the disease at bay is essential in the ensuring the wellbeing of Zambia's communities and endangered wildlife.

Dr. Sichande also acts as a mentor to rural Zambian students aspiring to become veterinarians and who wish to follow in his footsteps.

PROTECTING ZAMBIA'S WILDLIFE BY AIR

Aerial support remains a crucial part in the anti-poaching efforts across South Luangwa National Park, without which, large and inaccessible distances of landscape could not be covered.

Dazzle Africa assists in the operational funding of the only plane used for anti-poaching and research in South Luangwa and supports the vital work that our field partners, Conservation South Luangwa and Zambian Carnivore Programme, are doing in the area. Thanks to Dazzle Africa champion, Dana Balaban, we funded the critical helicopter program which supplies rapid patrol deployment to those areas needed.

In 2022, the aerial unit conducted 115 surveillance patrols in the Cessna-180 aircraft and 76 helicopter operations, totaling 353 hours of aerial support. Thanks to these efforts, our field partners were able to detect wildlife carcasses, unrecovered elephant ivory, poachers' camps and illegal incidences of fishing and deforestation as well as detect and clamp down on poachers in action.

But the aerial support does not stop there. It is also used to help collect observational data on wildlife populations which helps support the overall management of the protected area run by the Department of National Parks & Wildlife (DNPW).

It also helps veterinary operations reach injured wildlife much quicker and can access remote areas that would otherwise be impossible to reach. In 2022, some of these operations included, collaring wild dogs in North Luangwa Park, desnaring a cheetah in the Bangweulu Wetlands, and supporting the successful relocation of a rhino in the North Luangwa Park.

FUNDING ANTI-POACHING OPERATIONS

Anti-poaching scouts stand at the forefront as they risk their lives to protect endangered and highly sought after wildlife.

Dazzle Africa is proud to be one of the supporters of Conservation South Luangwa's anti-poaching operations across South Luangwa Valley in Eastern Zambia.

This year, CSL's patrol teams were hard at work with 17,243 field days, 425 one-day patrols, 382 10-day patrols and 25 5-day patrols carried out and completed. During these partols, 161 wildlife crime suspects were arrested, 423 snares were recovered and 97 firearms, 61 pieces of bushmeat and 103 pieces of ivory were confiscated.

Community clean sweeps also form an integral part of CSL's anti-poaching operations with the goal to completely remove any illegal poaching activities in the area. In 2022, 102 community clean sweeps were carried out, resulting in the removal of a further 144 snares. Thanks to these combined efforts, a total of 576 snares were recovered and removed, helping prevent wildlife from coming in contact with these horrible and dangerous traps.

Our funds are also helping support the K9 Detection Dog Unit which consists of four highly trained dogs that are being used to counter wildlife trafficking and poaching. This year, the team conducted 198 operations, including the confiscation of firearms, bushmeat, ivory, animal parts and two live pangolins, one vervet monkey and 37 arrests.





LION RECOVERY FUND

This year, the Lion Recovery Fund (LRF) marked its fifth year of funding some of the most effective projects to help save Africa's iconic lions. During this time, LRF has funded projects that have helped reintroduce lions to places where they were previously extinct, recovered populations in countries where lions were on the brink, and tackled threats in 43% of lions range in Africa.

Dazzle Africa is proud to be a member of LRF's Lionscape Coalition which allows Africa's top tourism operators to support on-the-ground lion conservation work.

WOMEN IN WILDLIFE

Dazzle Africa works with our conservation partner, ZCP, to help fund the Women in Wildlife Conservation Training Program. This program aims to help aspiring female conservationists by pairing trainees with female mentors from their senior management team.

This year, nine women took part in the Women in Wildlife Program where they received one-on-one training in all aspects of field-based conservation.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH PROGRAMS

Dazzle Africa invests in engaging local communities through a series of community outreach programs run by the **Zambian Carnivore Programme**.

The Conservation Radio Show

The radio is a powerful media platform that can help us shine a spotlight on pressing conservation issues to mass audiences. Dazzle Africa is proud to sponsor ZCP's Conservation Radio Show which targets the residents of the **Luangwa Valley** with conservation-themed shows.

In 2022, 22 hours of Conservation Hour radio show was broadcasted to over 50,000 people with six hours dedicated to promoting and discussing CSL's new **Human-Wildlife Conflict Rapid Response unit**.

Community Game Drives

We support our field partner, Conservation South Luangwa, in their Community Game Drive initiative. This initiative supports local safari guides and takes community members on safari game drives with many having never visited South Luangwa National Park before! Often at times Mfuwe residents would have only seen the negative aspects of wildlife through conflict, but by going on safari, they are able to witness the beauty in their backyard and see wildlife in a different light.

This year, Conservation South Luangwa carried out 134 game drives with over 1,000 community members able to experience the magic of a Zambian Safari.



Mimbulu Soccer Academy

Dazzle Africa helps support The Mimbulu Soccer Academy ('mimbulu' meaning 'wild dogs') to connect and engage local communities through the shared love of soccer, while also promoting the importance of conservation in South Luangwa.

This year, the Mimbulu Soccer Academy carried out 36 football events, attracting an estimated total of 19,215 people, and communicating the shared conservation message through music, theater and banners at the games. This has proved to be a perfect platform to galvanize the support from Mfuwe residents for a wide range of conservation issues throughout the Luangwa Valley.

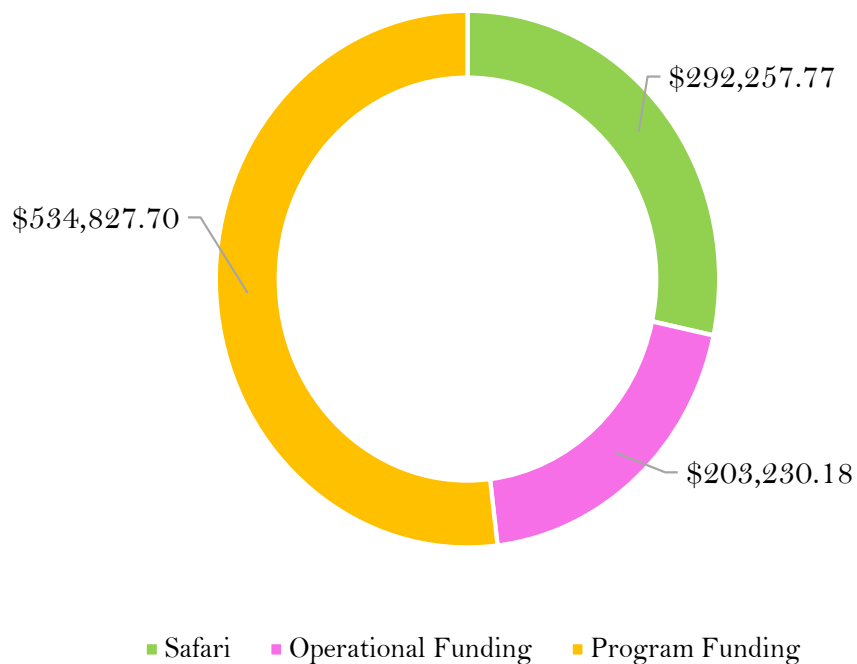


2022 FINANCIAL SUMMARY

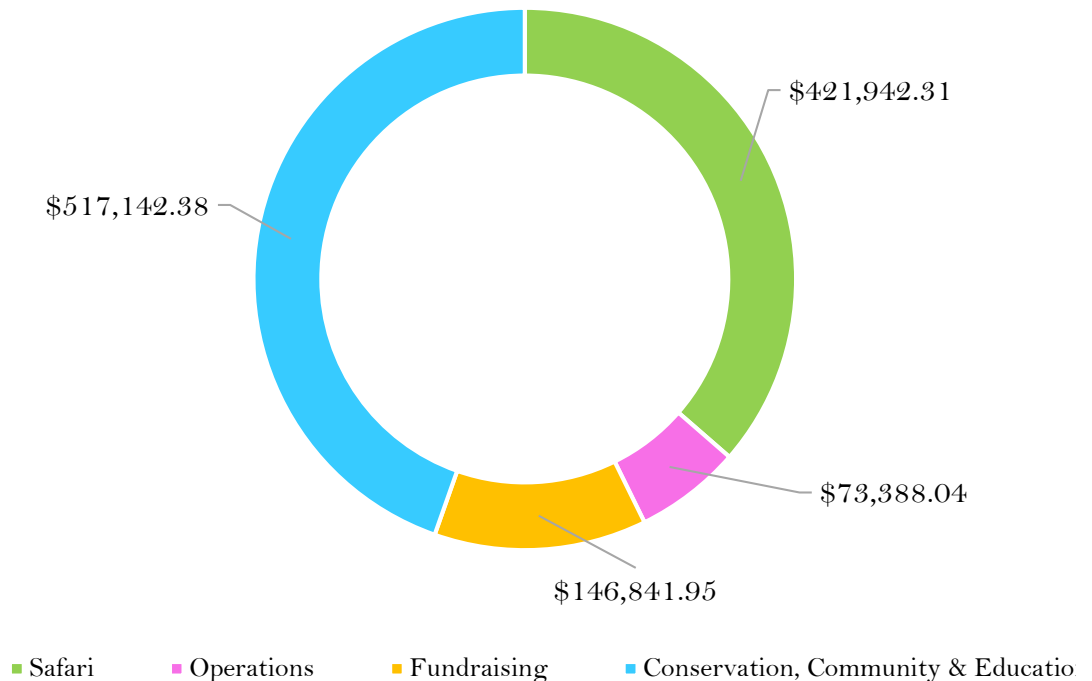
In 2022, Dazzle Africa raised a total of \$1,030,315.65 for our programs in Zambia, with \$517,142.38 invested in our conservation, community and education programs, accounting to 44.61% of total expenditure. 36.4% went towards safari program expenses and 12.67% and 6.33% went towards fundraising and operations respectively.
